I, ~~Mr. Nath Hore~~, son of late Sri Nath Hore, resident of ~~6B, Dr. Sarat Banarji Road, Calcutta,~~ District 24-Parganas, within the Municipality of Calcutta, by caste Kayestha, by religion Hindu, by profession a Retired Government Servant of Gazetted rank (Bengal Educational Service), being desirous of making provision as regards all my self-acquired properties, movable and immovable, after my death, do hereby execute this my last will quite freely, being in possession of my full senses and free from any undue influence, duress, coercion or prejudice.

2. My immovable properties consist of a three-storied pucca house at 6B, Dr. Sarat Banarji Road, Rash Behary Avenue, P.O. and a vacant plot of land, adjacent to my house, at 6A, Dr. Sarat Banarji Road, within the Municipal area of Calcutta. These are all my self-acquired immovable properties. The entire land, covering the above plots, was purchased from the Calcutta Improvement Trust (C.I.T. Scheme XXXIII) and the pucca house at 6B, Dr. Sarat Banarji Road, referred to above, was constructed with my own earnings. My house at 6B, Dr. Sarat Banarji Road, Calcutta, is partly let out to tenants (monthly and temporary) and partly occupied by me and my family.

3. I have ~~now~~ no ancestral properties, movable or immovable.

4. My movable properties consist of gold rings and buttons, binocular, clock, watch, furniture, books, clothes, utensils, etc. valued at about Rs. 3,000/-. The articles of furniture in the third flat of my house at 6B, Dr. Sarat Banarji Road,

Calcutta, were purchased by my daughter Srimati Bela Deb, M.A., with her own earnings and belong to her absolutely. These are (a). one Drawing Room suite in three pieces, (b). one Dressing Table, (c). one Centre Table, (d). two Peg Tables, (e). one Stool for the Dressing Table, (f). one Secretariat Table, (g). one ~~Cape~~ seated chair. She has been allowing me the use of these things.

5. I have also three Tea Garden shares in the Bengal Doonars National Tea Co. Ltd. (Jalpaiguri) and certificates. I have also Cash Deposits in some of the Banks (Nath Bank - Lake Market Office, Calcutta, and Rash Behary Avenue Postd Savings Bank). I have insured my life for Rs. 2,000/-, of which my wife Srimati Saroj Bala Hore will be the sole beneficiary after my death.

6. I have no debt or liability. The Corporation taxes, etc. will be paid from the income of the said immovable properties.

7. I have two sons and five daughters, among whom three daughters - (i). Shailo (alias Baju), (ii). Bela and (iii). Santi (alias Chhunu - Munu: alias Tuch-cha) are married. My wife, Srimati Saroj Bala Hore also is alive and living with me at 6B, Dr. Sarat Banerji Road, Calcutta.

8. My eldest son is Sailesh Kumar Hore (alias Mantoo). He is aged about 44 years. I disinherit him altogether. He will not get anything out of my properties, movable or immovable, and all self-acquired. My reasons for the disinheritance and exclusion of my said son Sailesh Kumar Hore (alias Mantoo) from all my properties are given below:-

(a).

(a). He has ever been disobedient, disrespectful, may often defiant in his attitude towards me, the owner of the properties.

(b). He has never been of any use to the family financially or in any other way. He has never spent a pice even towards his own maintenance, although he gave out to his own mother and others that he was earning Rs. 300/- a day.

(c). He was most cruelly indifferent towards his younger brother and two grown-up younger sisters, even when they - and particularly the said sisters - had been dangerously ill for a long time. He never cared to go out during that long period of their illness to call in any Doctor or get any medicine for them.

(d). He has beaten most mercilessly the two ailing sisters and other grown-up sisters too on some occasions. He has beaten his own mother several times and actually came to beat me, when I could not pay for his suit he had ordered for without my knowledge and consent.

(e). He is a man of extremely loose character. Once at Darjeeling the Police brought it to my notice that there was a case under sec. 354 I.P.C. against him. He attempted to violate the chastity of several - successive maid servants of my house in Calcutta and indulged in guilty love with girls of some families too. And when he was scolded by me and other members of my family, he proved himself to be a source of danger to our personal safety and to the peace of the family.

(f). He has ever been reckless in wasting my hard earned money and has shown absolutely no consideration for others of my family or for the safety of my house and belongings.

9. My wife, Srimati Saroj Bala Hore, will have to be maintained by the 1 gatoga named below at the present and usual standard until her death. This I enjoin as a condition for their possessing the properties I am leaving behind for them. The Tea Garden shares and other shares in her name, if any, purchased with my money, will be enjoyed by her absolutely.

10. My entire properties, movable and immovable and all self-acquired, will go to my younger son, Girindra Nath Hore (alias Mintoo) who is now about 31 years old, and to my five daughters, named below, in the following manner:-

(i). Ground floor of my three-storied house, referred to above, and the Garage: The Northern Block of the ground floor and the garage are given to my son, Girindra Nath Hore (alias Mintoo). The Southern Block of the ground floor is given to my daughter, Srimati Santi Kar (alias Chhunu-munu - alias Tuch-cha), wife of Sri Sachindra Kumar Kar, Head Assistant, Telegraph Engineering Department, City Division, Calcutta, and Secretary to the Bengal Theosophical Society, Calcutta. The kitchen, yard, bath room and latrine are to be shared equally by Girindra Nath and Santi.

(ii). 1st floor or 2nd flat of my three-storied house, referred to above: The Southern Block of this floor is given to my daughter, Miss Sudhira (alias Polly) Hore, subject to the sole occupation of the Southern-most room of the said Block by my wife, Srimati Saroj Bala Hore, so long as she is alive. The Northern Block of this floor is to go to my daughter, Srimati Shailo Bala Sarkar (alias Bajju), wife of Prof. Upendra Chandra Sarkar, Reader in Law,

Jullundur Law College (Punjab - India), The kitchen,
bath room, and latrine of this Block are to be shared
by these daughters and my wife, Srimati Saroj Bala Hore,
equally.

(iii). Second floor or 3rd flat of the three-
storied house, referred to above: Here the Northern
Block will go to my daughter, Srimati Bela Deb, M.A.,
wife of Sri Gyanendra Chandra Deb, an Officer attached to
the U. K. Trade Commissioner's Office, Calcutta. The
Southern Block is to go to my daughter Miss Chitra
(alias Mary) Hore. Here too, the kitchen, bath room
and latrine are to be shared by them equally.

(iv). The use of the roof of this three-storied
house and of the tube well is allowed to my wife,
Srimati Saroj Bela Hore, my son, Girindra Nath Hore
(alias Mintoo) and the five daughters mentioned above.

(v). The vacant plot No. 6A, Dr. Sarat Banerji
Road, Calcutta, I give to my son, Girindra Nath Hore
(alias Mintoo) and to my daughter, Srimati Bela Deb,
M.A., in equal shares.

11. My movable properties, consisting of a
binocular, clock, watch, furniture, utensils, books,
clothes, gold rings and buttons, etc. etc. are to go
in entirety to my son, Girindra Nath Hore (alias
Mintoo). My three shares in the Bengal Doorgs National
Tea Co. Ltd. (Jalpaiguri), my Cash Certificates (in
the Nath Bank), and my Postal Savings Bank Deposits
are also to go to the said Girindra Nath Hore.

12. My reasons for giving to Girindra Nath (alias
Mintoo) a portion of the three storied house, the
entire garage, half share of the vacant plot at 6A,
Dr. Sarat Banerji Road, Calcutta, and all my shares
and certificates and all my movable properties are
these -

these: I have all along noticed he is very kind, affectionately disposed towards his mother, myself, and his sisters and has ever been most sincerely anxious to do his very best to make us happy and to be no burden to me financially. I do hope that, when I am dead and gone, he will continue to be of service and help to his mother and sisters.

13. Here I owe an explanation also for my giving to my daughter Srimati Bela Deb, M.A., a portion of the three storied house and also half of the vacant plot, referred to above.

(a). During the period of her School and College education she tried her best to see that she was no burden to me financially. In the Dacca University, whence she passed the M.A. Examination (in English), she supported herself partly by the Lewis Competition prizes, which she won.

(b). And immediately after passing the M.A. Examination, she, then quite a young thing, went out to the Wide World to earn money and helped me, her mother and her brothers and sisters financially, particularly when two of the sisters were very ill for a long time, and in many other ways too till she actually left my house after her marriage.

(c). And even for her marriage expenses, it must be said to her credit that she did not permit me even to spend -/4/- for an "Exercise Book" I bought for keeping accounts therein. She did bear all her marriage expenses herself from her own earnings.

(d). Having lost all my savings, amounting to about Rs. 17,000/- in the Nath Bank, which collapsed, I was prepared to meet her marriage expenses from sale or mortgage of my vacant plot, referred to above. But she did not permit me to do it either.

(c). On the ~~contrary~~, on the eve of her departure from my house after her marriage, she left some money with her unmarried sister, Miss Sudhira (alias Polly) More with instructions to give it to me.

14. If, God forbid, my son, Girindra Nath More (alias Minto) or any of my unmarried daughters die before their marriage or die without any issue after marriage, his or her share will go to the rest of my children, excepting Sailesh Kumar More (alias Mantoo), in equal shares absolutely. If Girindra Nath More (alias Minto) dies, leaving a widow without any child, his shares will go to her absolutely, If any of the married daughters dies, her share (shares in the case of Srimati Bela Deb, M.A.) will go to her OWN child or children equally, as the case may be. If any of the married daughters predecease me, in that case also the share or shares, given to her, will be obtained and enjoyed by her OWN child or children, as the case may be.

15. I do hereby authorise my son, Girindra Nath More, to draw the amount of pension that may be due to me at the time of my death - either singly or along with any of my daughters, who may be available then.

16. The Sradh expenses for myself and my wife, Srimati Saroj Bala More, and the marriage expenses of my unmarried daughters, if any at the time of my death, will be borne by my son, Girindra Nath More (alias Minto), and my married daughters in equal proportion.

17. I do hereby appoint my younger son, Girindra Nath More (alias Minto), my son-in-law, Sri Sachindra Kumar

Kumar Kar, and my daughter, Srimati Bela Devi Kar,
as the Executors and Executrix respectively of my Will.
My son, Girindra Nath Hore (alias Mintoo), will take

administering the Estate left by me. The Executors and
Executrix will not be paid anything as remuneration for
acting as Executors and Executrix.
