- (f) Since the Company's turnover as per last audited financial statements is less than Rs.50 Crores and its borrowings from banks and financial institutions at any time during the year is less than Rs.25 Crores, the Company is exempted from getting an audit opinion with respect to the adequacy of the internal financial controls over financial reporting of the company and the operating effectiveness of such controls vide notification dated June 13, 2017; and
- (g) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the provision of the section 197 of the Act and the rules there under are not applicable to the company as it is a private company.

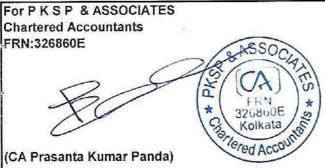

NOTES FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS:

1 | Significant Accounting Policies :

(a) System of Accounting:

The financial statements have been prepared and presented under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis of accounting following generally accepted accounting principls in India (GAAP) and comply with the Acconting Standards specified under section 133 of the Act read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules 2014 and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013.

(b) Revenue Recognition:

The Company follows mercantile system of accounting and recognises Income & Expenditure on accrual basis. Sales are recorded after adjusting Bad Deliveries.

(c) Fixes assets & Depreciation:

Fixed assets are stated at historical cost of acquisition/ construction inclusive of duties, taxes, incidental expenses and erection / commissioning expenses up to the date the asset is ready for intended use. On fixed assets, depreciation is provided on written down value method over the useful life in the mannerprescribed in schedule-II of the Companies Act,2013. The Company has adopted estimated useful life of Fixed Assets as stipulated under Schedule - II of the Companies Act, 2013.

(d) Impairment:

In accordance with AS 28 on 'Impairment of Assets', where there is an indication of impairment of the Company's assets related to cash generating units, the carrying amounts of such assets are reviewed ateach balance sheet date to determine whether there is any impairment. The recoverable amount of such assets is estimated as the higher of its net selling price and its value in use. An impairment loss is recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss whenever the carrying amount of such assets exceeds its recoverable amount.

(e) Borrowing Cost

Borrowing Cost which are directly related to acquisition/construction of a qualifying assets are capitalised. Other borrowing cost are charged to revenue on accrual basis.

Inventories:

The Stock - in - trade is valued at lower of cost (Weighted Average Basis) and net realisable value.

(g) Taxes on Income:

Current Tax:

Provision for Taxation is ascertained on the basis of assessable profit computed in accordance with the provisions of Income Tax Act, 1961 & tax advices, wherever considered necessary.

Deferred Tax:

Deferred Tax is recognised, subject to the consideration of prudence, as the tax effect of timing difference between the taxable income & accounting income computed for the current accounting year and reversal of earlier years' timing difference.

Deferred Tax Assets are recognised and carried forward to the extent that there is a reasonable certainty, except arising from unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward losses, which are kolkata recognised to the extent that there is virtual certainty, that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realised.

The management does not see any medium to long term risks in the Company's ability to continue as a going concern and meeting its liabilities as and when they fall due.

2.22 The entire amount of Preliminary Expenses of Rs.50000/- has been written off during the year as income generated this year.
