Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of KALYKES REALITY PRIVATE LIMITED ("the company"), which comprise the balance sheet as at 31st March 2023, and the statement of profit and loss for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2023, and its Loss for the year ended on that date.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES TO ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH, 2023

NOTE 1 : SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

About Company:

The Kalykes Reality Private Limited (CIN: U74999WB2018PTC224587) is an entity incorporated in India and is engaged in the business of sale & purchase of real estates and construction of buildings. Its registered office is situated at 13 /1, (P-336/1) SAHAPUR COLONY, KOLKATA - 700053, West Bengal (India).

a) Basis for preparation of Financial Statements:

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India (Indian GAAP) to comply with the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. The financial statements have been prepared on accrual basis under the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year.

b) Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting period end. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known / materialized.

c) Fixed Assets (Property, Plant & Equipment) and Depreciation

Freehold land if any is carried at historical cost. All other items of Property, Plant and Equipment' are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses if any. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items such as purchase price, freight, duties and levies. Such cost includes the cost of replacing parts of the Property, Plant and Equipment' and the borrowing cost till the date of installation of qualifying asset, net changes on foreign exchange contract adjustments it' any (including premium or discount arising at the inception of forward exchange contracts) arising from exchange rate variations attributable to such assets and any attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use. Expenses incurred on start-up, commissioning of the project including expenditure incurred on test runs and experimental production in respect of new unit if any, are also capitalised.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. The carrying amount of any component accounted for as a separate asset is derecognised when replaced.

All other repairs and maintenance are charged to profit and loss during the reporting period in which they are incurred.

An item of Property, Plant and Equipment' and any significant part initially recognised is derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Any gain or loss arising on derecognition of the asset (calculated as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the earrying amount of the asset) is included in the statement of profit and loss when the asset is derecognised.

Further, when each major inspection is performed, its cost is recognised in the carrying amount of the item of 'Property, Plant and Equipment' as a replacement if the recognition criteria are satisfied. Machinery spares which are specific to a particular item of Property, Plant and Equipment' and whose use is expected to be irregular are capitalized as Property, Plant and Equipment'.

c) Fixed Assets (Property, Plant & Equipment) and Depreciation (Cont.)

Spare parts are capitalized when they meet the definition of Property, Plant and Equipment' i.e., when the Company intends to use these for more than a period of 12 months.

As per the technical opinion obtained by the Company, the Machinery if any held by the Company does not involve decommissioning cost and the cost of removal of the Machinery is not material considering the size of the Company. Considering this aspect, the Company has not made any policies for capitalising the decommissioning cost.

Depreciation on Property, Plant & Equipment' generally is provided on the Straight Line Method over the useful lives of the assets and residual value in terms of Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013. Depreciation for the assets purchased/sold during the period is proportionately charged. Building constructed on the lease hold land if any, is depreciated over the period of lease or the useful life in terms of Schedule II of the Companies Act 2013, whichever expires earlier. Leasehold land if any, is amortized over the period of the lease. Improvements to buildings are amortized over the period of remaining useful life of the building. The residual values, useful lives and methods of depreciation of 'Property, Plant and Equipment' are reviewed at each financial year end and adjusted prospectively, it' appropriate and under such circumstances the appropriate disclosure is being made in the notes to

d) Intangible Assets and Amortisation:

Intangible assets are stated at the consideration paid for acquisition/cost of development less accumulated amortization and impairment loss, if any, Intangible assets are amortised over 3 years from the date of capitalisation.

e) Inventories:

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Net realisable value represents the estimated selling price for inventories less estimated costs of completion and costs necessary to make the sale.

f) Employee Benefit:

The amount of short-term employee benefits expected to be paid in exchange for the services rendered by employees are recoganised as an expense during the period when the employees render the services. These benefits include performance incentives and compensated absences

Post employement benefits

Defined Contribution Plans

A defined contribution plan is a post-employment benefit plan under which the Company makes specified monthly contributions towards Provident Fund, Employes State Insurance Scheme. The Company's contribution is recognised as an expense in the Statement of Profit and Loss during the period in which the employee renders the related service.

Defined benefit plans

The company is not liable to contribute any amount towards defined benefit plans and other post-employement benefits. Therefore there is no policy for accounting of the employee benefits. The provisions are as per the statutory requirement of Gratuity Act.

g) Foreign Currency Transactions:

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated at the exchange rates prevailing on the dates of transaction. Monetary items denominated in foreign currencies at the year end are restated at year end rates. Non monetary foreign currency items are carried at cost. Any loss or gain on account of exchange difference either on settlement or on translations are recognised in the Profit & Loss Account except in cases where they relate to acquisition of fixed assets (purchase from outside India), in which case they are adjusted to the carrying cost of such fixed assets.

h) Lease Transactions:

The transactions in respect of the assets given under operating lease are recorded in accordance with the requirements of Accounting Standard 19. The cost of such assets leased out is recorded as a fixed asset in the Balance Sheet and depreciation thereof is charged in accordance with the accounting policy of the Company.

i)Taxes on Income:

The Company has charged off the Current Income Tax to the Statement of Profit and Loss. Deferred Tax Assets/Liabilities are recognized/ provided in accordance with the Accounting Standard 22. Deferred tax is measured based on the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the Balance Sheet date, on the timing differences being the difference between the taxable income and accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent period. Deferred Tax Asset is recognized, subject to the considerations of prudence. Deferred Tax Asset so recognized, is being netted off to Deferred Tax Liability or vice versa. Advance Income Tax Paid (including Tax Deducted at Source, tax paid on self assessment or otherwise) and provision for current Income Tax are presented in the Balance Sheet after setting off the same against each other.

j) Borrowing costs:

Borrowing cost if any, are recognised as an expense in the year in which they are incurred except which are directly attributable to acquisition/construction of qualifying assets, till the time such assets are ready for use in which case the borrowing costs are capitalised as part of the cost of the asset.

k) Provisions, Contingent Liabilities & Contingent Assets:

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and its probable that there will be outflow of resources. Provisions not made in the account, which otherwise should have been made are disclosed by way of appropriate note, wherever applicable. Contingent liabilities are not recognized but are disclosed in the notes. Contingent assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements.

1) Impairment of Assets:

The Company has framed the policy of impairing the asset, when carrying value of the assets exceeds its recoverable amount, under the circumstances when the Company is having the sources of information (whether internal or external) that an impairment loss may have occurred. Accordingly, impairment losses will be charged to Statement of profit and loss in the year in which an asset is identified as impaired. The impairment losses recognized in prior accounting periods is reversed if there has been a change in the estimate of the recoverable amount.

m) Earning per share:

Basic earning per share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders(after deducting attributable taxes) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. Diluted earning per share is not calculated since there are no dilutive potential equity shares outstanding during the period.

n) Expenditure during construction/pre-operative period:

o) Revenue Recognition:

Interest income is recognized on time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and rates applicable. Income from service is accounted on accrual basis net of service tax. Income by way of rent on cancellable operating lease, of movable assets, recognized on accrual basis, over the term of the lease.

p) Operating Cycle:

Based on the nature of activities of the Company, the Company has determined its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of classification of its assets and liabilities as current and non-current.

q) Cash Flow Statement:

Cash flow statement prepared under indirect method, as prescribed by Accounting Standard 3. Term Deposit held with a maturity period beyond 3 months, earmarked balances with Banks and deposits held as margin money or security against borrowings etc have not been considered as "cash and cash equivalent", in the Cash Flow Statement.

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- 32 The company is not required to spend towards Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) specified under the provisions of Sec. 135 (1) of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the Companies (CSR Policy) Rules, 2014 made thereunder as the company does not satisfy any of the specified criteria during the immediately preceding financial year.
- 33 The Company does not have any employee who has completed the period eligible for entitlement of gratuity hence the same is not provided in the books.
- 34 The company is engaged in the business of construction which is a single line of product. The entire operations are governed by the same set of risk and returns, hence the same has been considered as representing a single business segment. The said treatment is in accordance with the guiding principles enunciated in Accounting Standard-17 on 'Segment Reporting'. The Company during the year is operating under one geographical segment and one reportable business segment within the meaning of Accounting Standard 17. Therefore, disclosure as prescribed under Accounting Standard 17 "Segment Reporting" is not applicable.
- 35 The company has made a detailed assessment under COVID19 of its liquidity positions for the next year and the recoverability of receivables, carrying value of it's assets comprising Property. Plant and Equipment's, Investments. Inventory and Trade Receivables. The company has perfrined sensitivity analysis on the assumptions used and based on current indicators of future economic conditions, the company expects to recove the carrying amount of these assets.
- 36 Previous year figures has been regrouped /reclassified wherever considered necessary.
