

THE NATIONAL BUILDING REGULATORY AUTHORITY (NBRA) was established under the National Building Act, 1984. Its primary objective is to regulate the building industry in Kenya to ensure the safety, health and welfare of the public. The Authority is responsible for the regulation of the building industry, including the registration of architects, engineers, and other building professionals, and the regulation of building standards and codes of practice.

The Authority is a statutory body established under the National Building Act, 1984. It is responsible for the regulation of the building industry in Kenya. The Authority's functions include the registration of building professionals, the regulation of building standards and codes of practice, and the regulation of building contracts and conditions of sale.

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PARTY'S COPY

Design of all structural members shall conform to the standards specified in the National Building Code of Kenya.

A suitable stamp shall be provided in the building contract for the distribution of copies of the contract documents to the relevant authorities.

For every copy of the contract documents, the contractor shall provide a copy to the relevant authorities.

The building contract shall be subject to the provisions of the National Building Act, 1984.

CONSTRUCTION SITE SHALL BE SECURED AT ALL TIMES AND ACCESS TO THE SITE SHALL BE RESTRICTED TO AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL ONLY. ALL WELLS, TRENCHES, CHANNELS, OPENINGS AND EXCAVATIONS SHALL BE PROPERLY COVERED AND SAFELY GUARDED AT ALL TIMES.

THE SANCTION SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE NATIONAL BUILDING ACT, 1984.
